COMPLETED LITTLEFIELD TOWNSHIP **ROAD WORK in 2013**

This year the township wedged Honeysette Road, Smith Road (between Lakeview and Mission Rd) and Valley Road (west of Moore Road). The township also curbed, guttered and paved the Milton/US 31 intersection in conjunction with the paving of the bike path. And they cracked sealed South Ayr Road, Armock Road and Cincinnati Point for a total of .89 miles.

WELL ATTENDED GRAND OPENING OF THE NEW TRAIL FROM SPRING LAKE TO ALANSON

Originally slated for July 4th, the trail was finally completed by the end of September. It was very popular even before its completion and newspaper articles had to be published advising all to wait to use it until it was completed. Construction of the trail went smoothly except for one difficult section. Part of the rail corridor property was unobtainable so plans were made for an alternate route requiring a boardwalk. During construction it was found that the pilings needed to be seated much deeper than planned. This section will require ungoing maintenance due to drainage off the highway. It is finally done, however, and has already proved to be a wonderful and useful addition to our community.

There are four Wayfinding signs that are called Kiosks which have information about the area and directional maps. There are a lot of directional posts with arrows and distance of miles all along the way. The Petoskey Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation helped fund six benches along the new path. There are safety signs for both path users and motorists crossing the path. There is a temporary ending point marked at Powers Road in Alanson. The Road Commission will be striping this in the spring to direct the path users onto Milton Road. The next step which could begin construction as soon as June of 2015 will go from Chicago Street in Alanson to Mackinac City! This future trail will be crushed limestone instead of blacktop. An example of crushed limestone can be seen on the Gaylord to Mackinac Trail. Emmet County along with the Townships will take on the job of maintenance.

Art Drayton was officially appointed as the new fire chief for the Alanson-Littlefield Fire Department. We are very fortunate to have this experienced, capable individual heading up our township fire department.

This year the fire department received a grant for the purchase of 15 new hoses from the Local Revenue Sharing Board of Emmet County. The LRSB distributes a portion of the electronic gaming revenues from the Odawa Casino each year. The agreement with the state of Michigan and the tribe is to give 2 percent of net revenues from its electronic gaming operations to the regional community. Serving on the LRSB are Emmet County Commissioner Dan Plasencia; Bear Creek Township Supervisor Dennis Keiser; and Resort Township Supervisor Bob Wheaton.
