GRANT AWARDED FOR PROPOSED HAY LAKE MARINA/PARK

Littlefield Township has received a \$200,000.00 acquisition grant from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MDNRTF) for the purchase of the Admiral's Point Marina on Crooked River. The Littlefield Township Board of Trustees submitted their grant application to the MDNRTF on April 1, 2015 and was notified in December 7, 2015 that their grant application was recommended for approval. Once finalized, the acquisition will give the public access to almost 24 acres on the Inland Waterway.

The acquisition of Admiral's Pointe Marina is an important step in achieving the Littlefield Township Board of Trustee's vision of gaining public access to the Inland Waterway. In order to receive grant funds from the MDNRTF, the township first had to create and adopt a recreation plan that conformed to the guidelines established by the MDNR. Since 2006, Littlefield Township has twice partnered with the Village of Alanson in developing joint recreation plans. When these recreation plans are accepted by the MDNR they have grant eligibility for 5 years. The current recreation plan will expire in 2017.

With the recreation plan in place, the board of trustees was in a position to begin looking at properties that would meet their needs. When Admiral's Point became available the township pursued the acquisition in earnest.

There are 2 other development grants being pursued at this time and there will be an update in the Winter 2016 Newsletter

Fire Department Receives Grant

The Fire department has received a \$4000 grant from the Emmet County Revenue Sharing Board. The request was for \$7600 to replace one hose and 2 heat sensing cameras. These are up to date cameras which are much smaller and lighter and more advanced in their ability to locate hot spots in areas that cannot be seen by the eye, such as inside walls. According to our Fire Chief Art Drayton, the hoses receive yearly inspections and one hose this year did not pass part of that inspection.


