LITTLEFIELD TOWNSHIP EMMET COUNTY, MICHIGAN

CONSUMER FIREWORKS ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. <u>148</u>

An ordinance to protect the health, safety and general welfare of Littlefield Township through regulation of the use of consumer fireworks, pursuant to Public Act 256 of 2011, as amended, to prescribe the penalties for the violation thereof, and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

THE TOWNSHIP OF LITTLEFIELD ORDAINS:

- Section 1. Name. This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Littlefield Township Consumer Fireworks Ordinance.
- **Section 2. Purpose.** In the interest of maintaining public health, safety, and the general welfare and the comfort and repose of Littlefield Township residents and visitors, the township hereby provides for the regulation and use of consumer fireworks in Littlefield Township, as provided in PA 256 of 2011 (Michigan Compiled Law 28.451, *et seq.*), as amended, and repeals all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.
- Section 3. Interpretation. This ordinance shall be interpreted in accordance with the definitions included in Michigan Fireworks Safety Act, PA 256 of 2011, as amended.
- Section 4. Novelties and Low Impact Fireworks. This ordinance does not apply to and does not regulate the use of Novelties and Low Impact Fireworks in Littlefield Township.
- Section 5. Regulation of Consumer Fireworks Use. In accordance with MCL 28.457 and any successor provisions, the ignition, discharge, and use of Consumer Fireworks in Littlefield Township is prohibited at all times except for the following days after 11 a.m.:
 - A. December 31 until 1 a.m. on January 1.
 - B. The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
 - C. June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
 - D. July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
 - E. The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.

Section 6. Further Provisions. The use of Consumer Fireworks in Littlefield Township is further subject to the following requirements and restrictions:

- A. A person shall not ignite, discharge, or use Consumer Fireworks on public property, school property, church property, or the property of another person without that organization's or person's express permission to use those fireworks on those premises.
- B. Consumer Fireworks shall not be sold to a minor.
- C. A person shall not use Consumer Fireworks while under the influence of alcoholic liquor, a controlled substance, or a combination of alcoholic liquor and a controlled substance.
- D. Consumer Fireworks shall only be used in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal laws.

Section 7. Violations and Penalties.

- A. **Municipal Civil Infraction.** Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction and shall be subject to a civil fine of \$1,000 for each violation of the ordinance and no other fine or sanction. \$500.00 of the fine collected under the ordinance shall be remitted to the local law enforcement agency responsible for enforcing the ordinance.
- B. Remedies Not Exclusive. The issuance of a citation for a municipal civil infraction shall not in any way limit the township from seeking enforcement of this ordinance in any other manner, including, but not limited to, an action to abate any nuisance created by a violation of this ordinance and to recover any costs, expenses, damages, and fees, including attorney fees, that may be permitted or allowed by law in connection with such abatement and the enforcement of this ordinance.

Section 8. Enforcement Officials. The township supervisor and any other designee of the township board, including the Emmet County Sheriff's Department or the Michigan State Police, are authorized to enforce this ordinance and are authorized to issue citations for violations.

Section 9. Nuisance Per Se. A violation of this ordinance is hereby declared to be a nuisance per se and is declared to be offensive to the public health, safety and welfare.

Section 10. Nonexclusively. The regulations in this ordinance shall be in addition to, and not exclusive of, any other state or federal law or regulation concerning the use of fireworks.

Section 11. Validity. If any section, provision or clause of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any remaining portions or application of this ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application.

Section 12. Effective Date and Repealer. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after publication of the ordinance or a summary thereof in the manner provided by law. All provisions of other ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
